

Memorandum of Association

MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION

OF

HEARING AND SPEECH CLINIC

1. The name of the Society is "Hearing and Speech Clinic".
2. The objects of the Society are:
 - (a) To take over the assets, liabilities, privileges and obligations of the unincorporated society heretofore known as Hearing and Speech Clinic, a Division of the Nova Scotia Rehabilitation Council Inc., and to continue the operation of its Clinic;
 - (b) To assess and treat, whenever possible, hearing problems in children and adults, and to assess and treat speech problems in children and adults;
 - (c) To provide counselling and advice in the selection of the most suitable type of hearing aid and as to its use, as well as such otolaryngological procedures as are indicated;
 - (d) To assess and treat such speech problems as simple mis-articulations, stuttering, delayed development of language, and to assist in the assessment and treatment of dyslexia and other types of learning disabilities such as aphasia;
 - (e) To give specialized assistance in laryngectomies and neurological disturbances involved with speech problems;
 - (f) To keep pace with scientific developments in the field of audiology and speech pathology and to train and develop skills in its staff members, to improve and enlarge facilities and services in the attainment of its objects;
 - (g) To advise on matters relating to the fields of audiology and speech pathology that may be considered or undertaken by the Society jointly or separately with or by the Federal, Provincial or Municipal governments or by any agency;
 - (h) To raise funds for the attainment of its objects by grants in aid from Federal, Provincial and Municipal governments, and to borrow, raise and secure payment of money in any other way which the Society may determine, to issue debentures or mortgage its real property to secure payment of money borrowed by it;
 - (i) To acquire and take by purchase, donation, devise, bequest or otherwise real estate and personal property and to hold, enjoy sell, exchange, lease, let, improve and develop the same and to erect and maintain buildings and structures;
 - (j) To contract and be contracted with and to sue and be sued in its corporate name;
 - (k) To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange and other negotiable or transferable instruments;
 - (l) To subscribe to or become a member of any other society or association whether incorporated or not whose objects are in whole or in part similar to its own objects;

- 3. The activities of the Society are to be carried on in the Province of Nova Scotia.
- 4. The registered office of the Society is 1318 Robie Street; Halifax, Nova Scotia.
